Not all dentists charge the same

The BC Dental Association produces an annual suggested fee guide for dentists in BC, and many dental plan carriers (such as Great-West Life) base plan coverage on the fees and codes published in this guide.

However, dentists are not obligated to follow the guide when they



charge fees for their services. If your dentist charges much higher than the fee guide, you could be surprised at how much you will be on the hook for.

It is strongly recommended that you find out exactly how much your portion of the cost will be...before the dentist begins their work.

Most dentists electronically file your claims directly with Great-West Life. Unlike other eligible medical expenses where you pay the full amount and then are reimbursed, you should only be paying your portion of the cost.
